The capybara is the world's largest rodent in the world; its closest relative is the guinea pig. They weigh about 77- 150 lbs., and their height is 20- 24 inches. They had very few natural predators, so they do not fear anything including humans, which is why they are so cool.

The Giant Otter is much bigger than a normal river otter you would see. A giant river otter weighs in at about 49-57 lbs. for female and for male about 57- 71 lbs., while the river otter only weighs in at about 10-33 lbs. Giant otters are incredibly dangerous while their normal meal is fish; they are also found to eat frog, anacondas, and even small caimans.

The amazon giant centipede, also known as the Peruvian giant yellow-leg centipede or Amazonian giant centipede, is the largest centipede in the world, with lengths exceeding thirty centimeters. Some specimens may have 21 or 23 segments. They have venom so you have to watch out for them, though rare to be fatal for humans some people may be allergic or sensitive to their venom, making it a dangerous situation.

The redbtail catfish is my favorite in the entire world, they are bottom dwellers that lay motionless during the day but are active and eat during the evening. They can reach five feet in length and can weigh up to 180 lbs. They are beautiful black with some design on their back and white stripes on their side with a vibrant red tail.

Fun Facts about Ring Tailed Lemur's Emma S. Grade 9

If you do not know what a Ring-Tailed Lemur is, they are a wild animal mostly found in southwestern Madagascar. Their rings on their tails are black and white and their body fur is gray with white faces and chests. Their tails can get as long as their body.

Ring Tailed Lemur's are the most commonly found kind of lemur. The lemur from Madagascar is a Ring-Tailed Lemur. There are over one hundred species of lemurs in all shapes, colors, and sizes! They are also the oldest living primate in the world.

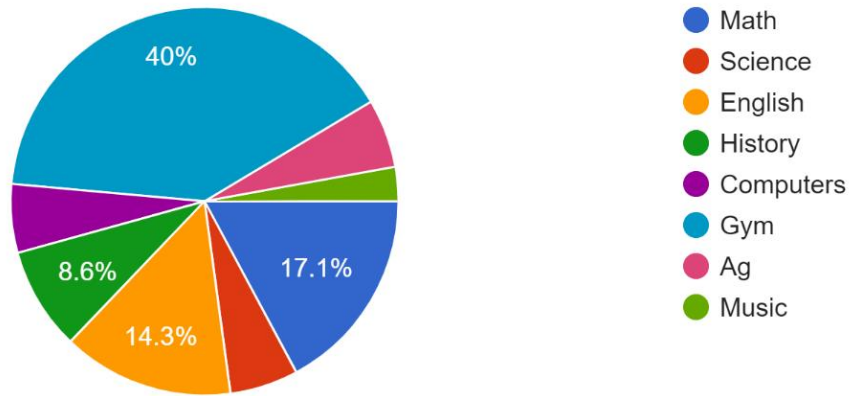
Ring tailed lemurs have scent glands on their wrist and chests to mark their explore routes. Male lemurs have a horny spur on each of their wrist glands to pierce tree branches marking their scent on the tree. They can also use their scent glands on opponents they are facing when coming across one. Lemurs are one of the most vocal primates, they are mostly found in groups but when needed they have many different calls to get back to the group. A group of lemurs is also called a conspiracy. Their groups usually range from up to 3 to 25 individuals including multiple males and females.

Ring tailed lemurs usually eat many plant type products including fruit, leaves, and flowers. They also eat many different things on trees including bark and sap. Lemurs are occasionally marked as pets they are only legal to own in different states including Texas, Nevada, Florida, Alabama, and Nebraska. All other states have made it illegal to own a lemur.

The closest animal to a Lemur is a Galagoes, lorises, and tarsiers. Galapagos are commonly found in Africa. Lorises are commonly found in Asia. Tarsiers are commonly found in Borneo and the philippines. They are all in the same family and have many of the same characteristics, which also include Galapagos, lorises, and tarsiers.
