A Brief History of Poodles

Many people think that a dog resembling the Standard Poodle of today lived in Germany during the Middle Ages and gave rise to the poodle breed. Germany's water dog was the Poodle, much as England's was the English Water Spaniel, France's was the Barbet, Ireland's was the Irish Water Spaniel, and the Netherlands was the Wetterhoun. The Germanic name of the breed, the Poodle, or "Pudel" in English, which is derived from the Low German term "puddeln," which means "to splash," is one of the arguments in favor of this theory. Poodle-like dogs are frequently seen in the artwork of numerous German artists dating back to the 17th century. Some cytologists think the Poodle originated in France, where it was known as the "Caniche" (French for "duck dog"), and that the breed is descended from the Barbet.

Huntington's Disease

Huntington's disease is a neurodegenerative disorder that causes the progressive breakdown of nerve cells in the brain. Most people get signs or symptoms in their 30's or 40's but an onset of the disease may happen earlier or later in life. When the onset of the disease happens earlier in life it is called juvenile Huntington's disease. It is a rare inherited disease caused by a defective Huntington (HTT) gene. The HTT gene makes Huntingtin protein. This protein's function is unknown, but it is essential for normal neuron development before birth.

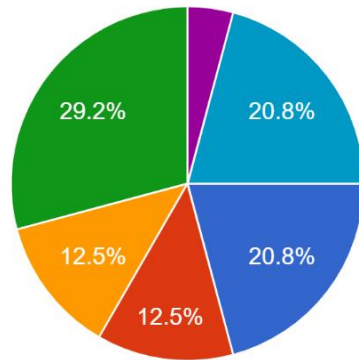
