
Have you ever wondered how ketchup was made? Well, it all happened in early 1812 when a man named James Mease released a recipe for tomato ketchup. It was made without salt, vinegar, and tomato pulp. It was packaged in brown or green-tinted glass bottles because they did not want the customer to see the product. In 1876 H.J. Heinz started selling his ketchup (back then they didn't call it ketchup they called it catsup which was commonly a thin dark fermented fish sauce that hid the taste of bad meat) it took him 57 tries to get it how he wanted it.

That is why there is still a 57 on the packaging. From then until now there haven't been many changes to Hinze's original ketchup, over the years they have changed it enough to comply with the FDA. But just recently they had to remove the crown on the top of the bottle because Queen Elizabeth passed away.


Hurricane Fiona strengthened to a category 3 storm Tuesday after dumping 2 feet of rain on Puerto Rico and leaving the entire island without power. Fiona made a second landfall Monday in the Dominican Republic near Boca de Yuma on the eastern side of the island with sustained winds of 90 mph and even higher gusts. On Monday, the hurricane hit the Dominican Republic with damaging winds and rain, causing more Flash Flooding. At least one person was killed in Puerto Rico as the then Category 1 storm slammed the island, officials announced Monday. Four helicopters are in the air surveying damage from Fiona. The governor says it would take at least a week to determine the damage left by the storm.
